REVIEW VOCABULARY

Attributes

These provide information about an element

(for example: href=" ", src=" ", alt=" ", style=" ")

Container Tag

A set of opening and closing tags

(for example: <h1></h1>)

DOCTYPE

Declares to the browser (like Firefox or Chrome) what kind of document it is being asked to read. In Web Design HTML is the typical DOCTYPE and is written as <!DOCTYPE html>.

Element

Everything from the opening tag to the closing tag including what comes in between

(for example: <h1>This is My Webpage</h1>)

Empty Tag

*Codes like
 are considered “empty” because they have no content and no closing tag.*

HTML Editor

A program designed specifically for coding websites

(for example: Notepad++)

Text Editor

A program that can be used for writing code, but can be used for other things as well

(for example: Notepad)

WYSIWYG

What You See Is What You Get – Any program where you can create or design a website without knowing much about coding. These are programs that include drag/drop, etc.

(for example: Weebly, Dreamweaver, WordPress)
